As a wider company project to mark the celebrations, our residents and staff across the group recreated events throughout the Queen's life to build our very own royal timeline of the Queen's reign.

There were some truly creative ideas involving fancy dress which were very popular on our social media pages. Each home also designed their own Platinum Jubilee stamp which we have used to create one collaborative Stow Healthcare Platinum Jubilee stamp. The perfect group project to mark the celebrations.

The Care Home Awards 2022 - Two amazing wins for Stow Healthcare Group

In July we attended the Care Home Awards lunch at the Royal London Garden Hotel London where Stow Healthcare were finalists in three categories.

This was the first time we had entered these awards and we were thrilled to come away with two award wins!

The first was 'Best Innovation in Care' for our two massive projects of 2021 – The Maple Memory Centre at Brandon Park and the COVID Designated Unit at our Cedars Place home in Essex – a huge achievement for these two homes.



Best for Innovation in Care Award





The second award was for 'Outstanding Smaller Group Care Provider (up to twenty-five homes).

This accolade marks a historic hat-trick of titles for the company at national level with Stow Healthcare currently holding the 'Care Group of the Year' title at the National Care Awards, Caring UK Awards and now Care Home Awards – all within the space of just eight months.

We understand this is the first time a single provider has won the top award at three different events within such a short period- a true testament to everyone in all of our homes who deliver the very best for our residents.

Outstanding Care Examples

At Stow Healthcare we strive to deliver Outstanding Care, but what does outstanding look like?

As many of you know we are regulated by the Care Quality Commission who inspect and rate our homes against five key lines of enquiry: Safe, Effective, Caring, Responsive and Well-Led. Examples of the care delivered in each of these areas contributes to the final rating of the home.

As we head into awards season, it has been heart-warming to read so many examples of the fantastic care delivered by teams and individuals that have had such a huge impact on the lives of our residents. We want to share some of our fantastic stories with you.

Outstandingly Responsive: Granting a Special Wish

A tender conversation, a quiet space, a 'blink and you might have missed it' moment. That was how it all started. Providing care whose impact reaches beyond that person, and touches their family, friends, and all those involved in their care is what the dedicated team at Stowlangtoft Hall have achieved.

Seeing the tattoo on the arm of long-term carer Sharon, sparked a conversation with terminally ill resident Sue that changed both their lives. Sue shared something completely unexpected and said that she had always wanted to get a tattoo, but 'had left it too late now'.

Sharon discussed with colleagues and, after confirming her wishes with Sue, the team set about trying to find a tattooist. Despite having a waiting list of seven months, a local tattooist immediately offered to help, and came to discuss with Sue what she would like, and to check if she felt she could manage the pain: 'Oh please, I've broken my femur before. I can handle a tattoo, especially if there's a Jack Daniels waiting for me at the end!' said Sue!



A date was set, although plans were thwarted when Sue had an unexpected seizure, and the date had to be rearranged. Sue was declining rapidly, but was still able to voice her decision to proceed.



The tattooist returned two days later, and together they chose Sue's tattoo, a beautiful delicate pink freesia on her hand to 'match her pink nails and t-shirt'.

Against all odds, the tattoo was completed in the presence of Sue's sister who had flown in from Australia to be with her.

Sue lived for only a matter of hours after her tattoo was completed. Her daughter and sister described it as 'perfect for her'.

Sue lived her life fully and passionately until the very moment it ended, and she was able to do this because our team truly cared.

Outstandingly Effective: Healing the unhealable

Wound care delivered at Melford Court in the last 18 months is an exemplar for the whole social care sector.

The team has achieved outcomes for residents that even the specialist tissue viability nurse thought were impossible. A resident with a grade 4 (most complex) pressure ulcer dating back prior to our company acquiring the home, has had her ulcer completely healed after 7 years through the intervention of the nursing and caring team over an 18 month period. One nurse, with a love for wounds, researched and liaised with the Tissue Viability Nurse (TVN) and pressed for a new type of dressing to be trialled.

Slowly, but surely, with frequent re-dressings and regular visits by the TVN, the care team has healed her wound, and her skin is now completely intact, having had a wound that previously saw her bone exposed.

Another lady, who acquired a grade 4 after a two week stay in hospital in September 2021 saw her life restricted as she had to be nursed in bed, with no ability to sit in a chair due to pain.

Her wound has vastly improved and with continued treatment is close to being healed. From being in a position of being permanently nursed in bed, the holistic care provided to the resident has seen her quality of life improve dramatically. This brings great joy to her and her husband as she can now enjoy walks around the garden in her specially designed wheelchair.



The Manson House Acquisition



Manson House is the newest member of the Stow Healthcare family.

We are delighted to have completed the purchase of this beautiful home, set on the historic Northgate Street in Bury St Edmunds, the home boasts features dating back as far as the 16th century and has a fabulous mature garden.

The home was bought from the Royal Agricultural Benevolent Institution, which is a charity dedicated to supporting farming people. The charity had owned the home for many years, and whilst it has traditionally given support, both in the home and also in the associated apartments in its grounds, to farming people, in recent years people of all backgrounds have been welcomed.

Manson House has received a significant facelift in the last decade, with a significant new extension being built to provide modern en suite bedrooms, taking the home to a potential maximum occupancy of 33 residents.



The light, airy and spacious suites are complemented by generous communal living spaces including a beautifully appointed conservatory, gorgeous dining room, and various lounges.

The garden is the real jewel in the crown, with many patios, trees, shrubs and flowering plants for residents to enjoy, as well as a fantastic garden room which offers maximum views of the surroundings.

Director Roger Catchpole said:

"We are delighted to announce the sale of Manson House from the RABI charity to Stow Healthcare has now completed.

Stow Healthcare strives to be the premier provider of residential and nursing care in the East of England and we are thrilled to carry on the good name of the home, and continue to invest in the building, the technology and our loyal staff to ensure every resident has a wonderful experience with us.

We are really excited to welcome Manson House to our Group at this key stage of our growth."



The home benefits from long-term staff, several of whom have given many years of service to the home and its residents.

In terms of future plans for the home, Stow Healthcare is looking to support the home to increase its occupancy, with a number of beautiful rooms available overlooking the garden, or the striking Northgate restaurant.



The home is also receiving a technology upgrade which will support the electronic administration of medication, which has been so successful in other Stow Healthcare homes.
